Entry C Exit System

- Largely replaces passport stamping
- Gradually reduces wait times in passport control queues

Where available, travellers with a biometric passport can present their travel documents at self-service systems. Border guards will help and/or oversee the process

The traveller must provide their documents and biometric data (facial images and fingerprints) at the self-service system

A border guard will verify the information received through self-service system, ask questions if needed, and then authorise or refuse entry to the traveller, which will be recorded in the system

• Informs travellers of the maximum duration of their authorised stays
